- Manage the change to a partly joint Sixth Form curriculum, ensuring outstanding outcomes for all.
- Develop the digital strategy, enabling the development of digital pedagogy, enhancing systems and reducing staff workload; and improving digital literacy through the curriculum.
- Build leadership capacity within the staff body and development opportunities to retain our excellent staff.
- Prioritise the development of Teaching and Learning excellence, including adaptive teaching proficiency in all staff.
- Develop our success with US, medical, engineering and Oxbridge applications.

- Enable our pupils with SEND to continue to make excellent progress.
- Review the KS3 curriculum to consider knowledge, skills, academic research, presentation, oracy, and self-efficacy.
- Ensure that pupils have proactive pastoral care through excellent support, for example through the embedding of the School Nurse role at KES, and an outstanding pastoral curriculum.
- Maintain breadth, inspiration and increase participation in our signature cocurricular programme.
- Continue to build an expert, unified and impactful Senior Leadership Team.
- Develop and deliver a bespoke Middle Leader Development Programme for new and aspiring middle leaders among our staff body.


