## Graduate Sports Assistants (residential option available)

King Edward's School in Birmingham, one of the best independent day schools in the country, seeks two Graduate Sports Assistants (one with a specialism in rugby, and one with a specialism in hockey). This is a term time position starting in late August 2026.

### The Role

This is an excellent opportunity to join a successful department, with a national reputation for Physical Education and Games, from late August 2026 to early July 2027. If you are an enthusiastic, knowledgeable, and skilled sportsperson who is looking to potentially move into a career in sport in the future, then we would like to hear from you.

The successful candidates will provide support across the sports department and work alongside the PE and sports coaching team, working with students from year 7 to Year 13. This will involve assisting with both management of school teams and also the House sport programme. They will be expected to be available at all times that school sport takes place, including Saturdays and evenings during term time.

We would welcome applicants who have a strong background in rugby and hockey.

**Hours:** This is a fixed term appointment which will run until 7<sup>th</sup> July 2027. The start date will coincide with KES pre-season activities and will be confirmed by the Director of Sport once pre-season dates have been set. The provisional start date will be 17<sup>th</sup> August 2026.

Whilst exact working times will vary, the earliest start time would be 7.45 and the latest finish time would generally be 5.30pm, unless the Graduate Sports Assistant is involved in any sporting fixtures.

**Accommodation:** Accommodation may be available on site, and is charged and deducted each calendar month

## **The Sports Department**

King Edward's School maintains a level of sporting involvement and success far beyond what might be expected of a traditionally highly academic boys' day school. The department's traditional "big three" team sports (Rugby, Hockey, Cricket) continue to thrive and are increasingly combined with a range of alternative provisions in response to pupil interest: athletics, fencing, racket-sports, football, water-polo etc. The school – through teams and individuals – achieves regional and national success in a range of sports, has consistently been named in the top Sporting Schools in the country by School Sport Magazine and is always included in the lists of top Cricketing schools by The Cricketer magazine.

The Department is staffed by a variety of committed full-time teaching and coaching staff with a traditional collection of teacher-coaches whose contribution has always been invaluable to provision at the school.

## **Facilities**

Set just outside Birmingham City Centre next to Birmingham University in Edgbaston, the School boasts enviable sporting facilities on site. As well as a new Sports Hall, fitness suite and classroom, we have three rugby pitches/cricket squares available on our immediate grounds, with an outstanding dedicated square and a first-team Rugby pitch close by with pavilion and tennis courts. A floodlit astro with its own pavilion hosts our first team Hockey fixtures, and we borrow a further two astros from the girls' school with whom we share a site. A world-class athletics facility is shared with the University. We also have an indoor 6-lane, 25-meter swimming pool.

We have excellent relationships with local and regional clubs in a wide variety of sports, particularly a growing and deepening partnership with Warwickshire Cricket Club.

- To help with the organisation of fixtures, transport and catering for one of the major sports.
- To take responsibility for the coaching of a squad in each term
- Referee/umpire school fixtures
- To assist, where required, with other School squads, including the 1st team in their major sport
- Ensuring proper record keeping within the department and ensuring that reporting, both internally and to parents, is consistent with the policy of the School.

To undertake any other reasonable duty related to the department that the Chief Master & Principal, Director of Sport, or Deputy Head (Co-curricular) may delegate.
